
Mission

Design Features

- Non-profit organization
- University membership dues + corporate contributions = funding support of member projects
- Development, application of solutions must involve 2 or more members (to achieve scale)
- Projects require an "implementation agent" (often a city) to ensure use of solution
- Must answer this question -

"What will become more sustainable as a result of this project?"
