KEY TENETS OF THE EPIC FRAMEWORK

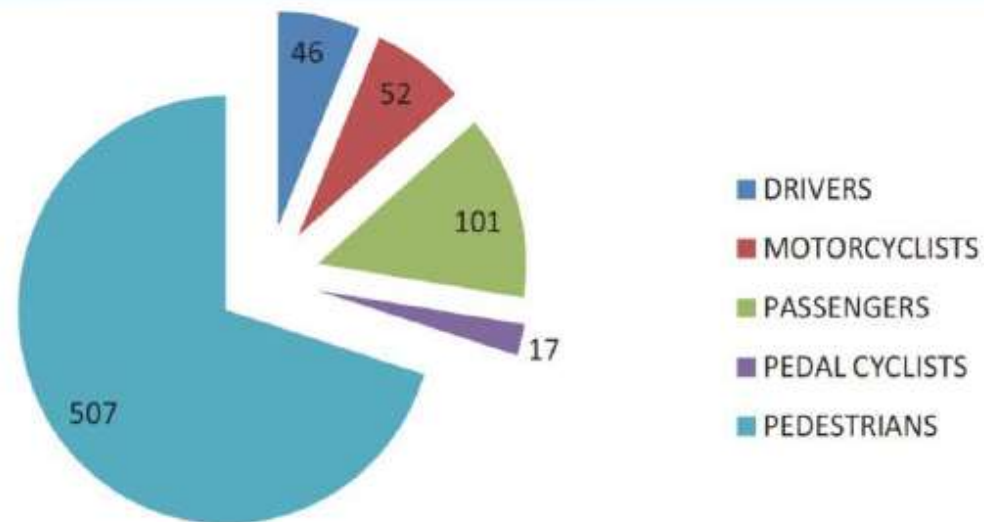
- The partnership is based on existing administrative structures of both universities and cities

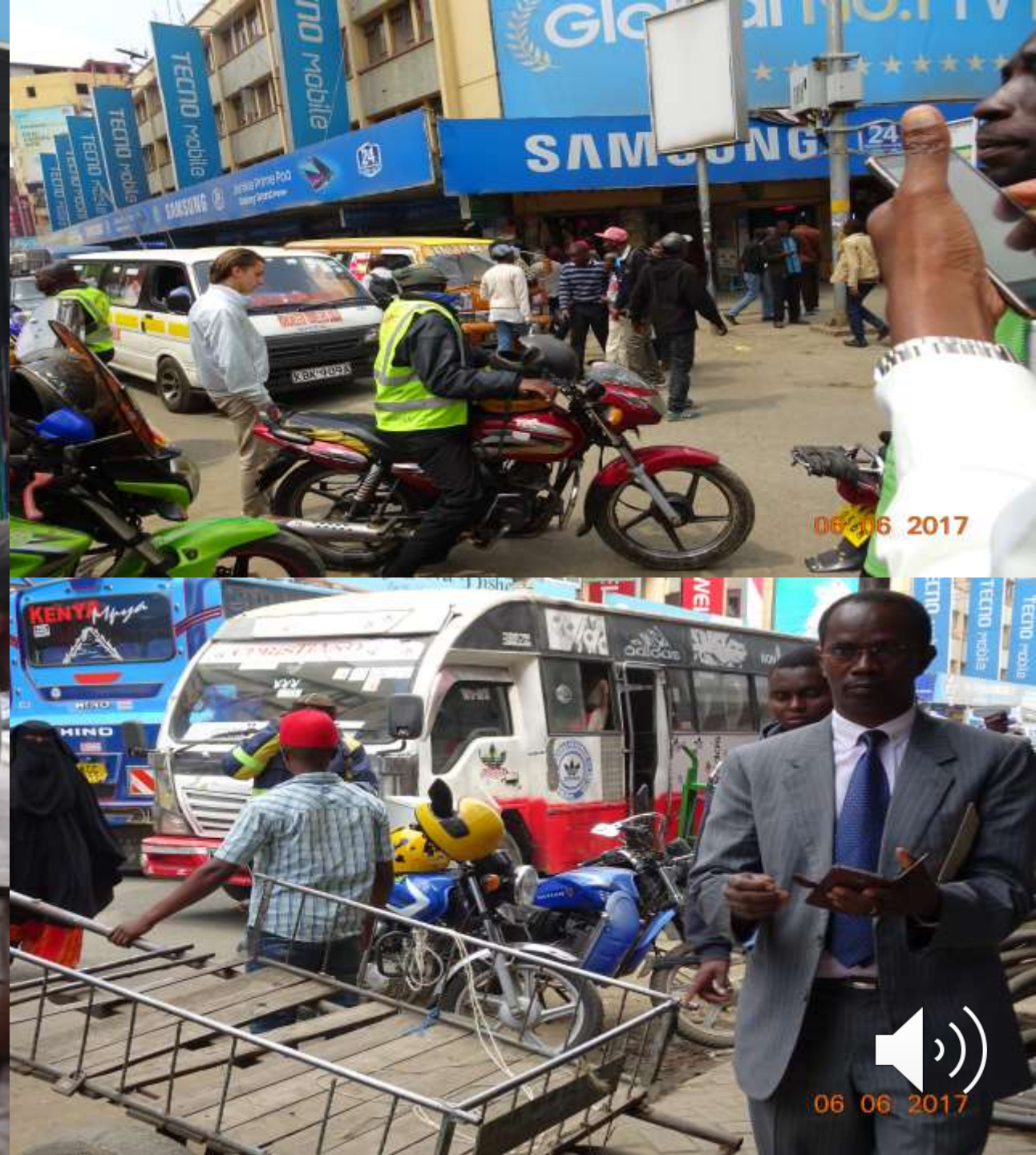

ORIGIN & IMPACT

Changing Faces Competition was initiated by Dandora Transformation League, which has run three successful editions since 2014.



The Changing Faces Competition has mobilized over 120 registered groups and more than 3,000 participants, transforming open spaces previously dumped with garbage into clean parks, gardens and playgrounds.

The transformations have resulted in a significant drop in crime rates, provided new income-generating opportunities for the youth, improved the health of residents and enhanced the overall quality of life in the neighbourhood.
